ABOUT THE BURT FAMILY CAROLS:

In the 1920s, Rev. Bates G. Burt (Abbie's great-grandfather) began penning an original Christmas carol each year and sending it as a greeting card to friends and family. He eventually passed the tradition to his son, Alfred Burt (Abbie's great-uncle), a jazz trumpeter and composer, who wrote a total of fifteen beloved Christmas carols, including the popular *Caroling, Caroling* and *Some Children See Him*, now sung and recorded by artists all over the world. Abbie took up the family tradition in 2001.

Carol of the Stranger was written in collaboration with celebrated poet Michael Dennis Browne, professor emeritus at the University of Minnesota. The poem takes its first line from a wall plaque that hangs above the poet's doorway, and inspiration from Charlotte Joko Beck (Everyday Zen), who challenges each of us to create A Bigger Container, so that the house (of self) may widen, embracing more contraries and allowing spaciousness of spirit. The carol premiered on Minnesota Public Radio in 2013, before being sent as a Christmas card to family and friends. (Suggested pairing: Alfred Burt's Christ in the Stranger's Guise.)



Abbie Betinis is an award-winning composer whose commissions have led to performances in some of the finest concert halls in the United States and beyond. A two-time McKnight Composer Fellow, she lives in Minnesota, where she has been composer-in-residence for The Rose Ensemble, The Singers-Minnesota Choral Artists, and The Schubert Club, as well as adjunct professor of composition at Concordia University-St. Paul.
