

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THE BURT FAMILY CAROL TRADITION

In 1922, Reverend Bates G. Burt, a self-taught musician, began composing annual Christmas carols and sending them out as seasonal greeting cards to his friends, family, and parishioners. Twenty years later, with a growing Christmas card list, he passed the job of composing these annual 'card-carols' to his son, Alfred Burt, a jazz trumpeter who had just received his music degree from the University of Michigan.

Alfred Burt wrote a total of fifteen well-loved Christmas carols, including "Caroling, Caroling," "Some Children See Him," and "The Star Carol" before his early death at age 33. Like his father, he also sent carols as Christmas cards to an ever-widening circle of family friends who delighted in their close harmony and poignant lyrics. Over the years, these carols have been recorded by the Boston Pops, Julie Andrews, Nat King Cole, George Winston, Simon and Garfunkel, Kenny Loggins, James Taylor, and many others.

Now Abbie Burt Betinis, great-granddaughter of Rev. Bates G. Burt and grand-niece of Alfred Burt, is taking up her pen each year to offer a fresh take on this old family tradition. Like the generations before her, she captures in music the timeless holiday themes that the Burt family and so many others celebrate annually: family, love, wonder, faith... and with a good dose of merriment, too.
